- *2011 Downtown Holiday Parade*



The City of Suffolk is pleased to announce the 2011 Downtown Holiday Parade will take place Saturday, December 10, 2011, at 7:00 p.m. The last evening parade in Suffolk was held in 2005 and was considered a resounding success by the nearly 3,500 spectators who enjoyed the celebration.

Along with the time change, we have selected a parade route that encompasses most of historic downtown and provides for limited disruption to vehicular traffic. The staging area, where floats, marching bands, cars, and dancers set up, will be established along Western Avenue extending from the U.S. Post Office into the Riverview Neighborhood, and may include parts of North Broad Street and surrounding access points. Groups taking part in the holiday parade include over 70 motorized units, equestrian units, marching units, floats and marching bands. Santa will join the parade to the delight of everyone! The event is free and open to the
